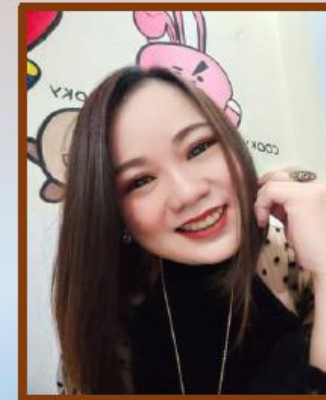

For the month of March, which was Women's Month, PNO was set to have a Talk Series on women empowerment featuring Captain Michelle Barja, a corporate helicopter pilot, and Director Amelia de Guzman, a geologist. A film showing was also planned and the culmination of the Women's Month celebration was the awarding ceremony for the Essay Writing Contest.

We were able to push through with Captain Barja's talk last March 11, 2020. However, due to the COVID 19 pandemic and the ECQ that was suddenly announced last March 15, 2020, the talk under Director de Guzman and the film showing were cancelled, and the awarding for the essay contest was put on hold.

By April, PNO CSR-GAD Committee members, while working from home, brainstormed on projects to address the impact of the COVID 19 pandemic. The PNO Health, Safety and Food Aid Project was approved by the Board; and the project included the donation of food packs and bottled water to medical front liners, and rice subsidies to caring facilities for disadvantaged children.

Part of the CSR-GAD HEALTH, SAFETY AND FOOD AID PROJECT
to Address the Impact of the COVID 19 Pandemic

- ▶ As part of PNOC's response to the call to provide assistance to the most vulnerable segment of the society and in recognition of the continuing contribution and resilience of the medical front liners in the fight against COVID-19, PNOC sought to provide food aid to selected caring facilities and government hospitals in PNOC's host communities.
- ▶ The project is being aligned with the Gender and Development (GAD) mandate in recognition of the participation of women in the care of disadvantaged children as well as women making up the majority of global healthcare providers and are also the primary caregivers to their families.

PNOC HEALTH, SAFETY AND FOOD AID PROJECT. As part of this project, PNOC provided necessary assistance to our medical front liners, distributing lunch and dinner packs and bottled water to the dedicated medical staff of the Philippine Army General Hospital, the Manila Naval Hospital, and the Taguig Pateros District Hospital.

These hospitals were identified as those that directly treat and assist the rising number of COVID 19 patients in the Taguig area. Around 60.0% of the medical and health personnel of these hospitals are women.

PNOC GFPS Chair Bel Cubelo and Members Rene Barbera and Josie Baguio led the distribution of the more than 2,000 food packs last May 25, 27, and 29, 2020.

The children of Bataan and Batangas are among those experiencing a breakdown of a normal family life, hence, became a priority effort for the SOS Children's Villages. These two provinces which have a high number of disadvantaged children are also PNOC areas of operation.
